1. Update on the Development of the MPO Metropolitan Transportation Plan 2050 and the FY 2027-2030 Transportation Improvement Program.

Stanley Consultants will provide an update on the development of the Eagle Pass Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) 2050 and the FY 2027–2030 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The presentation will include a summary of projects submitted through the Call for Projects process, discussion of regionally significant transportation projects, the project scoring and prioritization methodology, TIP development requirements, funding categories, and the proposed schedule for completion and adoption of both planning documents.

2. Discussion and Possible Action to Approve a Functional Classification Recommendation for the Patsy Winn Boulevard Extension Project.

The City of Eagle Pass has requested consideration of a functional classification designation for the Patsy Winn Boulevard Extension Project. Functional classification is a federally required process used to identify the role of a roadway within the regional transportation network and determine eligibility for certain federal transportation funding programs. The proposed roadway serves as a significant transportation corridor intended to improve regional mobility, connectivity, and access to developing residential, commercial, and recreational areas within the City of Eagle Pass

3. Discussion and possible action to Receive public testimony and initiate a 20-day public review and comment period for the draft FY 2027 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2027 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) identifies the transportation planning activities, tasks, and budget that will guide the Eagle Pass Metropolitan Planning Organization's planning process during the upcoming fiscal year. The draft FY 2027 UPWP has been developed in coordination with MPO partners and in accordance with federal and state transportation planning requirements. MPO staff is requesting authorization to initiate a 20-day public review and comment period to provide stakeholders and the public an opportunity to review and submit comments on the proposed document prior to final adoption by the Policy Board.

The City of Eagle Pass is seeking financial assistance through the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) State Infrastructure Bank (SIB) Loan Program to support the construction of the Patsy Winn Boulevard Extension Project. The proposed project consists of approximately 1.7 miles of roadway improvements intended to improve regional mobility, provide traffic relief to FM 3443 (Veterans Loop) and FM 375 (Bibb St.), enhance access to the City of Eagle Pass Sports Complex, and support future residential and commercial development within a key growth corridor of the community.
